composer Adam B. Silverman. On Sunday, Claude Frank plays a brooding piano quintet by Johannes Brahms. Audience members will also hear a tango-influenced piece for solo cello by the Grammy-winning Argentinean composer Osvaldo Golijov. - BY BRENDA TREMBLAY
